- The pattern of exam is similar to that of civil services, and selection is done in three phases.
- Selected candidates are sent for foundation training at the Lal Bahadur Shastri National Academy of Administration, which is followed by specialized orientation for the Forest Service at the Indira Gandhi National Forest Academy, Dehradun.
- After training candidates are posted as the assistant conservator, district conservator, chief conservator, principal conservator, and the inspector general of forests.
- The senior most post is that of the Environment Secretary in the Union Government

 - They must possess considerable physical stamina, endurance, and keen interest in nature conservation and animal protection.

- The biggest employer in India is Indian Railway having 17 zones. These zones are managed by the Railway Recruitment Board.
- The positions are based under groups like Group A, Group B, Group C and Group D.

1. Group 'A' Posts: Group A services

The posts/positions come under these services appointed by UPSC through Civil-Service Examination, Engineering Service Examination, and CMS.

2. Group 'B' Posts: Group B posts are not directly recruited, actually these posts are upgraded posts from Group 'C' posts, and the Group 'C' posts are managed as follows.



- Business schools commonly use the test as one of many selection criteria for admission into graduate business administration programs (e.g. MBA , Master of Accountancy, etc.) principally in the United States, but also in other English-speaking countries

IELTS

- IELTS is the International English Language Testing System which tests English proficiency across the globe. Conducting 1.4 million tests globally, IELTS is the world's most popular English testing system.
- IELTS is jointly managed by the University of Cambridge ESOL Examinations (Cambridge ESOL), British Council and IDP.
- IELTS tests are held in over 500 centres with tests up to four times a month.
- You can choose from two types of IELTS test: Academic or General Training, depending on whether you want to study, work or migrate.

- IELTS score is accepted by most Australian, British, Canadian, Irish, New Zealand and South African academic institutions, a few academic institutions in the United States, and various professional organisations.
- It is also a requirement for immigration to Australia and Canada.
- An IELTS result or Test Report Form is valid for two years in U.K., Canada, Australia, Newzeland.

TOEFL

- Test Of English As Foreign Language (TOEFL) One of the most widely used standardized English Tests which a **Non Native English student** needs to appear and qualify for studying abroad, scores of the TOEFL Test are accepted for almost all programs in US.
- There are two formats for the TOEFL test.
 1. The TOEFL iBT test measures reading, listening, speaking and writing skills. It is offered more than 50 times a year, and is administered online at more than 4,500 testing sites in 165 countries.
 2. The TOEFL PBT test measures reading, listening, grammar and writing skills and is currently offered only in locations where testing via the Internet is not available.
- A TOEFL score is valid for two years and You can retake the test as many times as you wish, but you cannot take it more than once in a 12-day period. If you already have a test appointment, you cannot register for another test date that is within 12 days of your existing appointment.

$P = (\text{number of candidates who have scored less marks than the candidate} / N) \times 100$ (where P is percentile and N is total number of candidates appeared for exam)


